**Additional information about the form categories:**

**Project reminders:** nighttime seat belt patrols should not start before 1900 hours and should not run longer than five hours unless you are detained by a traffic stop (DUI) that occurs during your patrol.

**Drug Related Arrests** -- include all drug arrests other than DUI, such as possession, sale/distribution, VUSCA.

**“Other Alcohol Related Arrests”** Example: MIP, open container, furnishing liquor to a minor, Neg 1.

**Definition of Contact:** Count one contact for each vehicle stopped. Also add one contact for each person who receives a citation other than the driver. For example: Driver is stopped for speeding (1 contact), two passengers are cited for no belt use (2 more contacts for a total of 3). However, a driver who receives multiple citations only counts as one contact.

**Aggressive Driving Definition:**

Any two or more moving violations in succession (i.e., speeding, following too closely, improper lane change, no signal, etc),

**OR**

Any single moving violation that causes another motorist to take evasive action to avoid a collision includes Neg 2.

**DUI Arrests:** include all impaired driving arrests – Alcohol AND Drugs, even those arrests handed off to another agency for processing.

**Major arrests or incidents:** it is helpful to us if you would add some narrative, either on another piece of paper, as an email or with handwriting on this form faxed over to us.
